Let this year be one of perseverance, kindness, and innovation. Let us work together to make our school a place where knowledge thrives, talents blossom, and dreams take flight.



Farheen discussed the workbook's structure, detailing how it guides educators in creating a safe environment for children to understand and address abuse.


Akshay Iyer highlighted the interactive elements within the workbook, focusing on how it engages children in activities that promote awareness and understanding.
